

Counselors In Training

The Kentucky region is blessed with many young people who wish to serve as a counselor in training. We understand that providing this leadership opportunity is our responsibility and can be an important part of a young person's leadership training. Because we have limited opportunities and to adhere with our counselor application process, an application to be a counselor in training is to be completed and signed by the candidate and their minister prior to acceptance.

1. Counselors In Training must:
 - ✓ be Church members and mature Christians who have attended camp.
 - ✓ be at least 16 years old.
 - ✓ be recommended by their minister prior to the beginning of camp.
 - ✓ be available to be at any of these camps if selected: Mini Camp, Junior Camp or Camp 101.
 - ✓ not occupy a cabin without an adult counselor in the cabin.
 - ✓ have a minimum of one day of training by the director or other designee.
 - ✓ remain at camp during the entire event.
 - ✓ not leave to run errands with on-site staff or others.
2. Counselors In Training will be utilized at the discretion of the directors.
3. No more than two Counselors In Training per event, and only if there is one adult per Counselor In Training to whom the CIT is immediately responsible.
4. CIT's are subject to the same rules and regulations as Adult Counselors. See Adult Counselor description for additional rules and duties.
5. CIT's are to **assist** the Adult Counselors and Director(s) in the event. This includes crafts, sweeping cabins, small group activities, tasks and study.
6. CIT's are to act as **counselors** and not campers.
7. CIT's may be sent home prior to the end of the event for significant infractions of the rules and policies according to the discretion of the director(s).
