Counselors in Training

The application must be completed and returned to the Regional Office in Lexington on or before March 1.

Counselors in training

- Must be church members and mature Christians who have attended camp for two years within the last four years
- Must be at least 16 years old on or before March 1
- Must be recommended by their minister as part of the application process
- Will be used at Mini Camp, Junior Camp, or Camp 101
- Will not occupy a cabin without an adult in the cabin
- Must remain at camp during the event
- Will have a minimum of one day of training by the director in consultation with the Associate Regional Minister or other designee
- Will be utilized at the discretion of that camp's director(s)

CITs typically serve one camp per summer. As space permits, some CITs may be offered the chance to serve two weekend camps. A camp does not have more than two CITs on staff.

CITs are to assist adult counselors and directors with various camp activities.

CITs are to act as **COUNSELORS** and not campers.

CITs may be sent home prior to the end of the event for significant infractions of the rules and policies according to the discretion of the director(s) in consultation with Dave Carr and/or a designee.

The WKDH site team will choose CIT candidates. The names of those selected to serve as CITs will then be forwarded to the directors of Camp 101, Mini Camp, and Junior Camp to utilize the gifts of these youth.
