



he Kentucky Quilt/Knit/Craft Retreat sponsored by the Christian Church in Kentucky's Women's Ministries was held at First Christian Church, Berea on June 24-27. 41 delightful, spirit-filled people gathered to spend time honing their craft and remembering how their creativity is a part of their spiritual journey. The group is always ecumenical in nature. There were quilters, knitters, a weaver, crocheters, and crafters. The group began and ended the day with prayers and focus. During the retreat, several tours of the area were offered. This retreat has been held for 18 years. Traditionally, we ask participants to count how many items they have made for charity over the past year. This year they listed 1,149 items. The group does a silent auction, with proceeds going to Week of Compassion, and this year's total was \$800. A trunk full of yarn was donated to New Life of Christ Christian Church in Louisville. We made five comfort quilts to be donated to a police unit for use with children in crises. We look forward to planning another amazing retreat next year. Dates will be announced soon, and all are welcome. Even Regional Minister Don Gillett completed a Baby Quilt and got a sewing machine!



West Area Church Receives Grant to Offer Respite Care

his fall, First Christian Church, Madisonville has expanded its care for their community, bolstered by a \$10,000 grant from the National Benevolent Association of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). The Friends Place Respite Care ministry launched on November 12 - providing a safe and nurturing environment for





"We hope this new ministry will provide purpose, meaning, and hope for our friends living with dementia," said Rev. Kara Foster, Senior Pastor of FCC, Madisonville. "Friends Place is a ministry born out of a deep commitment to supporting both individuals with memory loss and their caregivers. This program will help them continue to live joy-filled, meaningful lives."

Friends Place is part of a national initiative through Respite For All, a network that brings respite care services to 40 local communities across the country. The program in Madisonville is the first site in Kentucky. It operates on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 10am to 2pm. Structured activities include brain-stimulating games, purposeful movement, dance, chair yoga, art and music therapy, bowling, chair volleyball, pet therapy, service projects, and intergenerational connection with preschooler visits. The cost is \$40 per day and includes a hot lunch.

As Respite for All describes the program, "Friends Place provides a safe, welcoming environment for older adults to participate in engaging activities, build social connections, and experience moments of joy and meaning in their daily lives. The program also serves as a crucial lifeline for caregivers, giving them time to rest, rejuvenate, and address their personal needs—knowing their loved ones are in trusted hands."



The NBA's support underscores the importance of communitybased initiatives that address mental and emotional health, recognizing the pressures caregivers often face and the essential service respite care provides. Friends Place can serve as a model for more congregations discerning similar ministries across our Area and Region.

Twenty-five volunteers attended the first training to serve with Friends Place at First Christian Church, Madisonville.

An Update from our Campgrounds

he 2024 camping season in Kentucky was a great success. Camps Kum-Ba-Ya and Wakon' Da-Ho combined to host over 640 children and youth at our 9 summer camp sessions. This was the highest attendance in a decade and put us back on par with our pre-COVID numbers. What is most encouraging is that our largest camps were elementary and middle school age groups, which bodes well for the future of our outdoor ministries, as these campers continue through high school.

Both camp sites are enjoying an era of facilities being upgraded. Kum-Ba-Ya has new air-conditioned and heated cabins with modern furniture. New boats and canoes have been added. New kitchen appliances were installed in the Billy Williams Lodge this year. Other projects are planned for the coming years. These improvements are attracting other churches and organizations to use KBY for their events, creating new revenue streams for this scenic property.

Wakon' Da-Ho has also recently added recreational opportunities to its campus. Most notably is the swimming pool, along with a gaga ball pit and a human foosball pitch. The construction of a new bathhouse will be completed soon, and the 2025 camps are looking forward to using this long awaited and sorely needed facility.

Planning for the 2025 camping season is well underway. We are very excited about the curriculum entitled *Another Way*:

Jesus often confronted the world around him with another way of being, and by his example, we are reminded that God always invites us to reimagine who we are and how we do things. Being at camp, we are already finding another way, away from worldly distractions of home. In the peace of this space, we will explore what would change if we lived as our authentic selves and respected the truths of others. In this humility, we will imagine how our growth changes the way we live. In this potential for transformation, we will imagine how our personal change meets the change we seek in the world. Whether we are addressing unfair rules or dreaming of a time when all people belong, we know that God calls us to do a new thing and faithfully forge another way.


